- Make sure you tick relevant boxes i.e. SUSI/DARE/HEAR/NUI EXEMTPION whatever relates to you.
- Course Choices = 10 Level 8s & 10 Level 6/7s should be listed
- Apply for as many courses as possible keep all your options open
- ORDER OF PREFERENCE! Number 1 on each list should be what you really want to do & where you really want to go
- Visit colleges on your lists
- Complete a course Investigation for each course on CAO Application
- Change of Mind: 01/05/2025 01/07/2025

- YOU MUST TICK THE BOX ON YOUR CAO APPLICATION TO SAY YOU ARE APPLYING FOR DARE!! (01/02/2025 deadline)
- Section A = Personal Statement (1,500 words) <u>YOU MUST FILL OUT ONLINE THROUGH YOUR CAO</u> BEFORE 01/03/2024 – this is a piece about how you feel your condition affected you in secondary school
- Section B = Education Impact Statement (EIS) <u>will be filled out by school</u> in January and a copy will be sent home with you to SEND TO CAO BEFORE 15/03/2025
- Section C = Evidence of Disability (this is the report that you received diagnosing your condition/if diagnosed by consultant/psychiatrist) SECTION C form must be completed and SENT TO CAO BEFORE 15/03/2025

3. HEAR APPLICATION:

- HEAR is you/your guardians responsibility school plays no part!
- YOU MUST TICK THE BOX ON YOUR CAO APPLICATION TO SAY YOU ARE APPLYING FOR HEAR!! (Deadline 01/02/2025)
- All sections for HEAR should be filled in online before the 01/03/2025.
- Information is based on 2023 financial records of your parents/guardians only
- If your parents/guardians were on social welfare in 2023 then you will need to get the social welfare to fill out a form also
- Any supporting documentation should be sent to the CAO before the 15/03/2024

This can be filled in at home with your parents/guardians but there is also a section that Mr Mc Mahon must sign.

- Pay a small deposit to hold your place
- Or be placed on a waiting list
